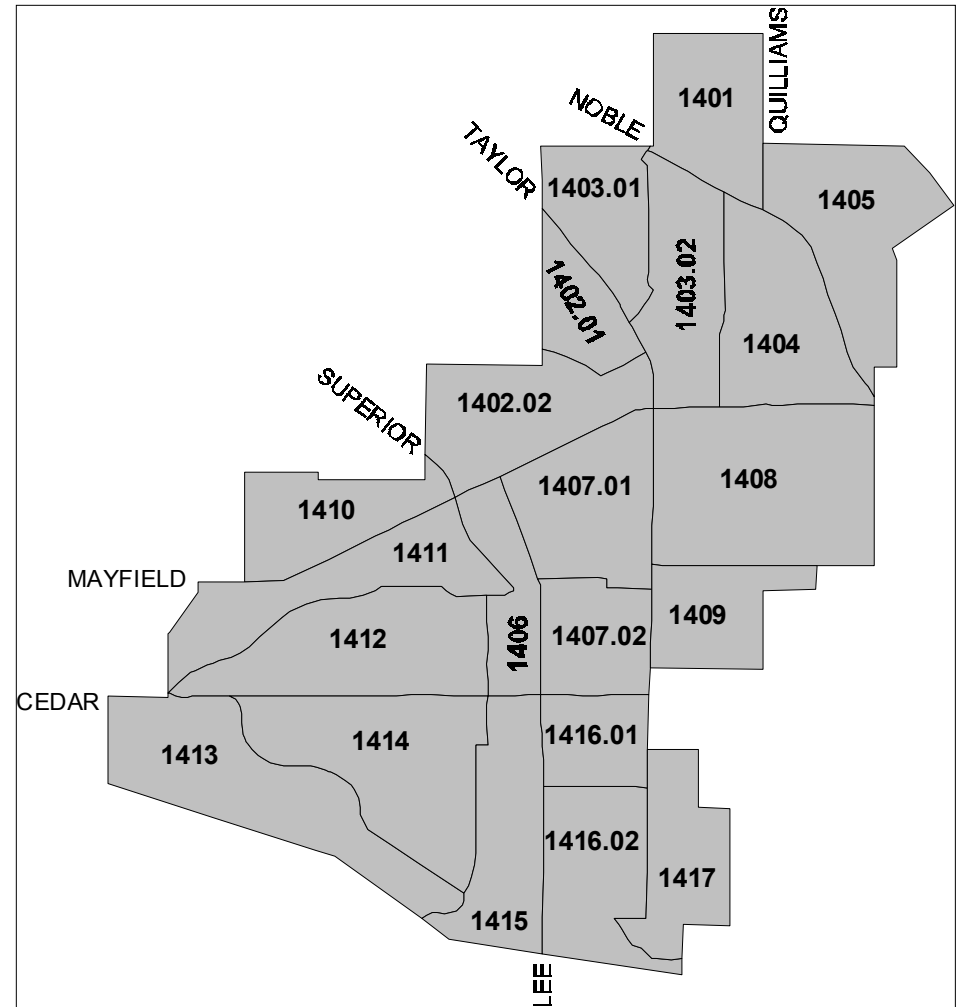

**City of Cleveland Heights, concise demographic profile, 2000 and 1990 compared, citywide and by census tract**

**NOTES:**

1. The City successfully challenged its original 2000 census population, which was 49,958. 667 Case Western Reserve University dormitory students who lived in Cleveland Heights were mistakenly assigned to another municipality. This error was in census tract 1413.  
  
The revised total population for the entire city is 50,769.
2. The 2000 census was the first in which persons were able to claim more than one race.
3. In 1990, Asians and Pacific Islanders were grouped together. In 2000, this grouping was subdivided into (1.) Asians and (2.) Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders.
4. The Cleveland-Lorain-Elyria primary metropolitan statistical area (PMSA) consists of Cuyahoga, Lorain, Medina, Geauga, Lake, and Ashtabula Counties. The Akron PMSA consists of Summit and Portage Counties. The two PMSAs together constitute the Cleveland-Akron consolidated metropolitan statistical area (CMSA).
5. Inflation adjustments are based on revised Consumer Price Index (CPI-U-RS) values released in April 2002. 1989 dollars are converted to 1999 dollars by multiplying them by 1.297861 (242.7/187.0).
6. To maintain consistency, percentages listed in these columns generally refer to percentages of figures that apply to the city or census tract as a whole, even when referring to a smaller group would be logical. For example, in line 33, the percentage of housing units that are owner-occupied refers to owner-occupied units as a percentage of all housing units in the city or census tract, rather than as a percentage of all occupied housing units in the city or census tract. An exception to this convention is found in lines 70 and 71 where the percentages of employed and unemployed individuals refer only to those who are in the civilian labor force.
7. On pages with census tract information, you will find some boxes with an ERR abbreviation. This is not indicative of an error or mistake; it merely indicates the presence of a formula involving a division operation which, in the specific case, had a divisor of zero. For example, this occurs in a census tract with no residents living in group quarters, and thus a group quarters population of zero.
